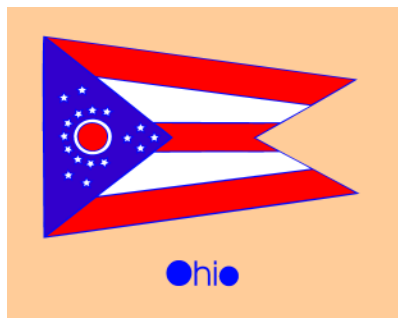


More Kool Things to See & Do in Ohio

Some Stuff about Ohio

Ohio became a state on March 1, 1803 and is the 34th largest state in the U.S. with a population of over eleven million folks who call themselves 'Ohioans'. The name Ohio comes from an Iroquois Indian word meaning 'Great River'. The Ohians' capital is Columbus, not too far from Campbell Hill, where the Klub Konvention will be this year. The Cardinal is the state bird. Guess how many other states call the Cardinal their state bird? Did you know their state flag is the only American state flag that is not a rectangle? Do you know why there are 17 stars on their flag? Ohio is sometimes called the Buckeye State. The buckeye is their state tree. Buckeyes are poisonous to cattle and probably humans but they have a lot of tannic acid in them which can be used in leathermaking. They're also pretty cool just to have and carry around as as souvenir. Candy stores like Marie's Candies near the highpoint dip peanut butter in chocolate to create a darn kool treat!
